VOLUNTEER AS A 'PILOT' ORGANIZATION

As part of our survey development process, our team is currently looking for organizations to participate in a two-day, on-site 'pilot', or mock survey, to evaluate the applicability and saliency of the standards and survey process. There is no cost to you only staff time, and any information gathered during our visit is confidential and will only be used for our research. We anticipate coordinating visits this spring.

The Joint Commission is developing an Assisted Living Community Accreditation Program to help providers deliver consistent, high reliable services and care in critical areas impacting the quality and safety of its residents and staff.

Not only is this a great opportunity for you to provide feedback on this new accreditation program's standards and survey process, but pilot organizations will receive:

We understand the need to conduct these pilots without compromising the safety of your residents and staff. For areas deemed appropriate for an on-site survey, surveyors will be required to wear a face covering throughout the pilot survey, practice appropriate physical distancing and abide by the facility's infection control protocols and CDC guidelines. Also, surveyors will not enter areas with COVID-19 positive residents.

Surveyors will not be permitted to travel if they display symptoms or report close contact with anyone confirmed or suspected of having COVID-19.
